Weekend Review: Energy Conquers Diamonds

The Houston Energy played its best game of the year this weekend, beating its long-time rivals the Dallas Diamonds. Energy Head Coach and Owner Brian Wiggins, recognizes the importance of the game for the team's season: "Both Dallas games were defining moments in our season, the first was disappointment and the second was exhilaration."

On Saturday, Houston jumped out to the early lead, scoring twice in the first seven minutes of the game. Dallas struck back just before halftime to pull to within a touchdown.

The second half was all Energy, however, as the home team gave Dallas a taste of its own medicine, controlling the clock on offense with sustained scoring drives. Defensively, Houston dominated Dallas down the stretch, ending their final offensive possessions with two successive Energy interceptions by free safety Melissa Ward and middle linebacker Dita Conway.

Wiggins sees the win as a key turning point: "I couldn't be more PROUD of my team after that game! It seems we are coming together just at the right time."
