Weekend Review: Energy Wins National Conference

The Houston Energy (7-1) finished the regular season with a convincing road win against the Wisconsin Wolves (5-3). The 33-0 victory earned the Energy first-place in the National Conference heading into playoffs.

Only 6 teams earn the distinction of being in the WPFL playoffs. The threeround, single-elimination bracket (below) begins Nov. 3 and culminates with the WPFL Championship game on Dec. 1. Rounding out the National Conference, the Indiana Speed (4-4) will face the Wisconsin Wolves in Round 1. Finishing second in the American Conference, the LA Amazons (7-1) will host the SoCal Scorpions (6-2) in the opening round.

Joining the Energy as a topseed, the Empire State Roar (8-0) finished first in the American Conference. The Roar and the Energy receive a first-round bye and will host second-round games on November 12. Energy celebrates

- Position: Kicker/Punter/TE
- Jersey Number: 3

- WPFL Experience: 6yrs, retired 2yrs
- Day Job: Application Analyst for CHRISTUS Health (IT)
- Favorite Part of the Game: The camaraderie. As a tight end, I feel a sense of belonging with the O-Line; as a kicker, I connect with the snapper and holder. I also love the moment right before a game starts. If we win the coin toss, our team has a chance to score first; if we kickoff, I'm the first person in the game to touch the ball.
- How Did You Get Into Football?: The first year Houston had a team, I checked the website and came to tryouts. Luckily, I can kick pretty well since we had over 400 women try out. I always told my brothers that if there was a women's team I would play. I never liked thing to be "not allowed" or "taboo" for girls.
- What Keeps You Playing?: Women's football is still a fledgling enterprise; I like being a part of building it and keeping it going.

- Most Memorable Moment: My first year, I was about 30th in a line of maybe 100 women trying out for kicker. Mainly relying on my soccer ability, I kicked the first one high and far, right through the uprights. I remember the two coaches looking at each other, one saying, "Let's move her back five yards." I kicked the second one with the same clearance as the first. As I walked away, I heard the coach say, "I think we found our kicker." There were still about 70 girls to go. That was a great moment.
- Season Goals: To get another ring. Also, I'd love to catch a TD pass and then follow it up with a PAT. Lastly, it would be cool to kick a 40+ yd field goal. I heard the record for a woman was 46yds. I'd love to beat that.
- Final Comments: It is exciting how many young girls are participating in football now. It shows that the culture around football and sports is changing. It's exciting to watch football no matter who is playing, and it's even more exciting that women of all ages are becoming more and more involved.
